# **Building and Construction**

#### The Work

Do you enjoy practical work using your hands? Are you interested in working mainly outdoors? Do you enjoy problem-solving and work that requires attention to detail?

There is a wide variety of jobs available in the construction industry. Building jobs include the construction and repair of buildings (e.g. houses, shops, schools). Civil Engineering jobs involve projects like roads, docks, tunnels, dams and bridges.

#### What's Happening?

Construction is the UK's biggest industry, with 2 million people already at work in more than 700 different types of jobs. (5.7% of the UK's total workforce). Of these, 44% are craftworkers, 6% operatives, 14% managers, 9% professionals and 5% technicians. Locally, 5% of the working population are employed in construction. Between 1998 and 2005, an additional construction 131,100 jobs were created. The UK has recently seen signs of a 'credit crunch' (a reduction in the availability of finance from banks and other financial institutions). Because of this some UK-wide firms have already reduced their work force, and many others are less willing to take on permanent employees in case they need to make job cuts. Even so, construction has been identified by 'West at Work' as a local area of growth where specific skills are, or will be, in demand. Some of the demand in this sector will come from new local development sites including: Bath - SouthGate, Bath Western Riverside; Bristol - Cabot Circus, Harbourside Phase 2, Temple Quarter, North Somerset - Locking Parklands, Weston Park; South Gloucestershire - Science Park (sPark).

#### Your Options at 16 & 17

#### Air Conditioning and Refrigeration – City and Guilds Level 1

(1 year). Entry requirements are a Grade C in an applied subject and Grade C's and D's in Maths and English.

#### **Building Craft Occupations – Foundation Construction Award**

(1 year). No formal qualifications are required but you will be required to attend an interview.

#### **Construction – National Diploma**

(2 years). Entry requirements are a minimum of 3 GCSEs at grade C or above in Math, science, English. **Construction – First Diploma** 

(1 year). Entry requirements are 2 GCSE passes at Grade E or above including English, Maths or Science.

#### Plumbing – Certificate in Basic Plumbing Level 2

(2 years). Applicants will be asked to attend an interview and undertake a college entrance test.

#### Plumbing – Certificate in Plumbing Studies – Level 3

(1 year). Entry requirements - applicants must have successfully completed the Certificate in Basic Plumbing - Level 2.

#### Stonecraft – NVQ Levels 2/3

(1 - 2 years). No formal entry qualifications. Will need to attend briefing session and may be required to undertake a college entrance test. The willingness to learn a demanding skill is essential.

#### Wood Occupations – Carpentry and Joinery, Bench Joinery, Bench Joinery – NVQ 2/3

(1 or 3 years). No formal entry qualifications. You will be asked to attend briefing session and may be required to undertake a college entrance test.

#### Brickwork – Diploma Level 1

(1 year). Entry requirements are a good standard of education and a personal interview. On this course you will develop all the basic bricklaying skills.

#### Carpentry and Joinery – Diploma Level 1

(1 year). Entry requirements: good general education and you will be asked to come for an interview. This course is for those who want to develop carpentry and joinery skills.

#### Furniture Studies – Foundation Certificate

(1 year). Entry requirements are by a personal interview. This course offers a broad introduction to furniture making.

#### Painting and Decorating – Diploma Level 1

(1 year). Entry requirements are a good general education and you will be asked to come for an interview. This course is suitable if you want to start work as a painter or decorator.

#### Plumbing – NVQ 1

(1 year). Entry requirements: 2 GCSEs at grade C or above in English and Maths or equivalent Key Skill qualification, plus a personal interview. You will learn the basics of bending, joining and fixing copper, steel and metal pipe work.

#### Woodmachining – Level 2

(1 year). Entry requirements are by a personal interview. A course suitable for those who wish to develop skills and confidence in the safe use of woodworking machines. Leads to employment into woodmachining, joinery or furniture industries.

#### Woodmachining – NVQ Level 2

(1 year). Evidence of relevant work experience is essential. If employed as a woodmachinist, you will experience the main types of machining and CNC procedures.

#### **Construction – BTEC First Diploma**

(1 Year). Entry requirements are at least 4 GCSEs in the C - E range (including English Language, Maths and Science). You must also be able to demonstrate an interest in the subject and a willingness to study this course. You will also need to have a course guidance interview and successfully complete an initial assessment test.

(2 Years). Entry requirements are at least 5 GCSEs in the A - C range and preferably Maths and English Language at grade C or above. Alternatively you will need an appropriate Level 2 qualification such as a BTEC First Diploma.
